## **Sport Premium Report**

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At St Martin's CE Primary School Academy, over a number of years we have provided the following:

- There have been opportunities for children to participate in a variety of sports and competitions.
- We have invested in sports equipment and facilities to ensure children are active during the school day outside of PE sessions.
- Staff have had access to high quality coaching in a variety of sports from specialist sports coaches, this
  has included continuing professional development for teachers to enable even better teaching of PE
  and sports.
- We have fostered a school-wide passion for well-being linked to positive mental health through sport and fitness.
